For nearly 200 years St. Margaret's was the preeminent organization on the Broadneck Peninsula — unchallenged in that role until Asbury (United) Methodist Church on Church Road in Arnold was launched in 1859. From 1692 and for the next 172 years St. Margaret's lived with slavery. The African-American history on the Broadneck Peninsula largely traces back to the families of St. Margarets Church. Asbury Broadneck United Methodist Church (nee Asbury Broadneck AME) just across the road from St. Margaret's Church in its own way grew out of St. Margaret's Church.

The organizers of Broadneck African-American Heritage Day want St. Margaret's to have a presence that day. We will have a booth, reflecting on our shared history. Let's join our neighbors, get to know our community, showing with our presence that we care.
