CHILDREN'S CHAPEL—9 A.M. SERVICE

Children's Chapel occurs at the 9 a.m. service for children from ages three to second grade. Children leave the nave during the sequence hymn following behind the cross which will come down the aisle and then go into the downstairs annex classroom with the children rejoining their parents at The Peace.
