# **Pop Up Pantry Needs**

The West Annapolis Pop Up Pantry is a drive-through food aid effort that occurs each Saturday at Annapolis Evangelical Presbyterian Church, providing vehicles with four to five bags of groceries. This generally includes fresh fruits and vegetables, chicken, rice, beans, masa, dairy, pantry staples, and even diapers for those in need. Their mission was, and remains, to support members of the Hispanic community who lost their income due to COVD-19 and do not have access to federal aid such as unemployment, stimulus checks, or loans. The pantry can also deliver healthy and nutritious groceries directly to otherwise unsupported Hispanic families who are sick, elderly, pregnant, or without another means to feed themselves or their children. 
