Music Gathering for Families Next Sunday, March 24

Led by Kate Caldwell and members of our youth choirs, all children in grades 5 and younger, along with their parents and siblings, will be invited next Sunday, March 24 to take Communion together before the rest of the congregation (at the 9:00 a.m. service). Then they will be dismissed directly to the Fellowship Hall in the formation building, where as a group they will pray together a special Post-Communion prayer, followed by learning a gathering or sending song. This special time of Christian formation and community building will expose children (particularly our younger age parishioners!) to new prayers and simple songs. Once over, the children will depart to their 10:15am Sunday School classes, while parents may join others at coffee hour or remain in the Fellowship Hall for any scheduled adult forum.

Compline by Candlelight

Each Wednesday evening in Lent we are holding a candlelight compline service every Wednesday evening at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary. As you journey through Lent, this will be an opportunity for prayers, quiet time, readings, and chanting to center our lives during this contemplative season.

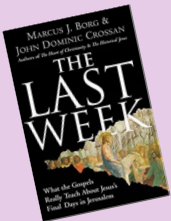
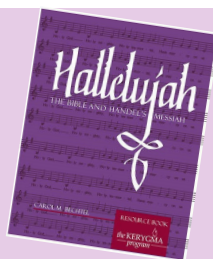

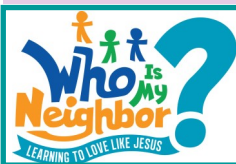
