#### **Thursday Morning Book Study Resumes Sept. 12**

Our Thursday morning book study class resumes Thursday, Sept. 12, 9:15 to 10:30 a.m., in Classroom E. For the first three weeks, the group will be focused on C.S. Lewis' "The Screwtape Letters." Then the group will begin a study of the author's "Mere Christianity." All are welcome to join. Childcare is available in the church nursery.

#### **Children/Youth Music Open House on Sept. 21**

Join members of the SMC music ministry team for a fun morning of music making! All returning choristers and newcomers will join for full warm-up, then split into three groups (grades K-2, 3-5, and 6-12) for rehearsals to prepare music for the next morning's worship services. Those youth who play instruments, including guitar and drums, will also gather together. During a snack break, there will be time for Q&A for parents, followed by a short informal worship service to conclude the day's activities. This will give both youth and their families the chance to sing and play the music they learned earlier in the day. That Sunday, all new and returning choristers will sing the anthems at the 9 and 11:15 a.m. services. At 9:00 a.m., children will participate in the entire service. Grades K-5 will sing an opening Introit at the start, grades 6-12 will sing during Communion, and all will sing during the Offertory at the middle of the service. At 11:15am, they will sing at the same times but with a slightly different protocol that will be discussed during the open house the day before and in communications leading up to September 22..

\*Register for church or group events and Sunday School;

\*Give online any gifts such as a regular pledge, Capital Campaign payment, altar flower donation, space usage payment, Faith & Fellowship meal payment, etc.;

\*Add or change your photo included with your contact information and look up a person to view a photo of them (children's photos are not being used);

\*Reach out to a parishioner by just tapping on their profile page instead of looking for an email address; and

\*Make a stewardship pledge (starting Sept. 15) for the 2020 program year.
